Ornament

Making Your Own Ornament

- Have your child color the front and back of the ornament.
- When he has finished coloring the ornament, cut out the front and the back, following along the dotted lines.
- If you'd like to make the ornament a bit sturdier:
 - You can create a third layer for the ornament by tracing around either the front or the back image on a piece of cardboard or card stock to transfer the shape to the cardboard or card stock.
 - Then cut out the shape you've traced on the cardboard or card stock.
 - Glue the cardboard or card stock shape to the back of the front image of the ornament so that the colored side faces out.
- Glue the front image to the back image so that the colored sides face outward and the features match up.
- Let the glue on your ornament dry.
- Once the glue has dried, punch out the hole at the top of the ornament.
- Cut a piece of string or yarn at least 6" in length.
- Thread the string through the hole at the top of the ornament.
- Tie the two ends of the string together to create a loop.
- Hang your ornament!



What You'll Need:

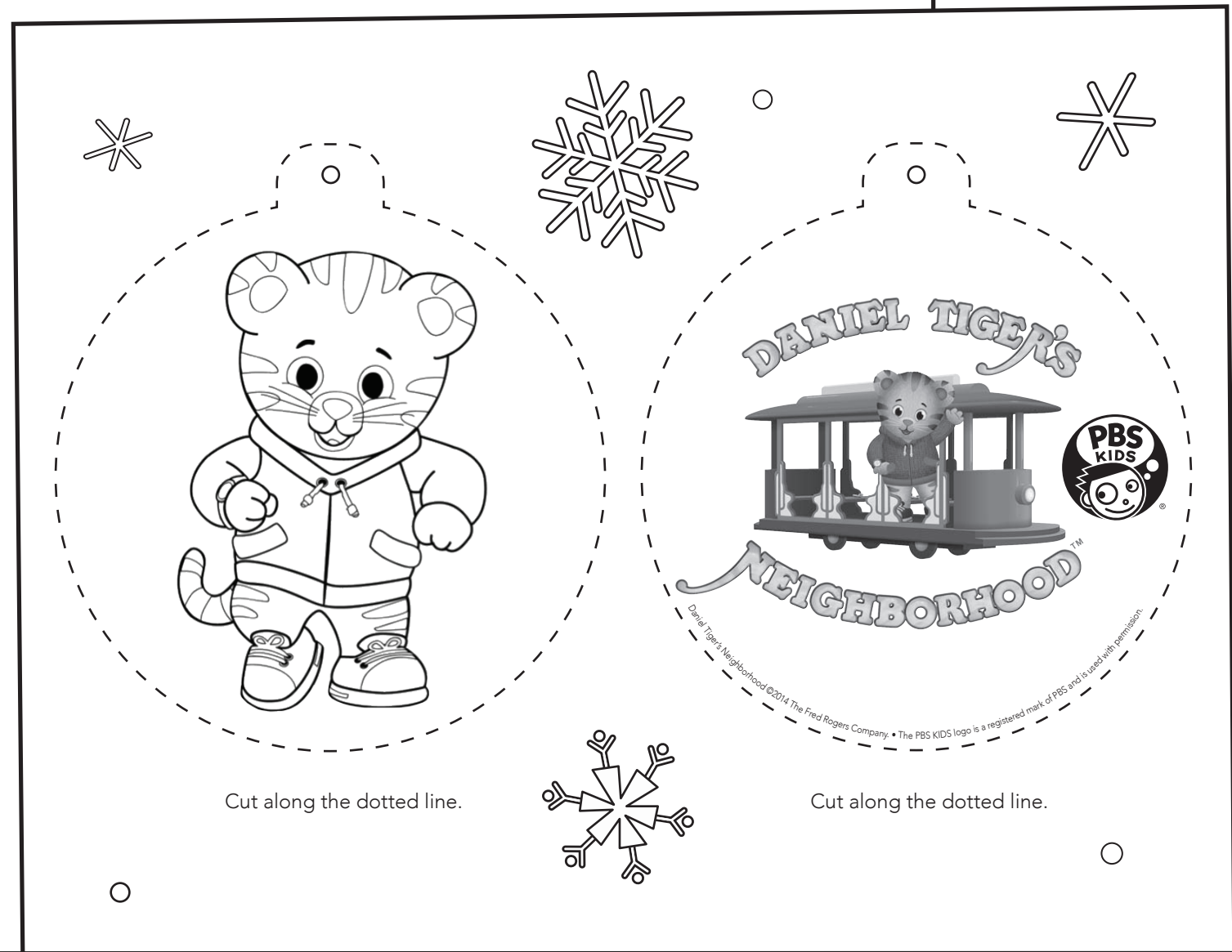
- Safety scissors
- Washable crayons or markers
- Glue or glue stick
- String or yarn
- A hole punch
- Light card stock or cardboard (optional)
